Preparing to Teach

Play with blocks on the floor.

Use a child's chair for this song. Have a child climb up and stand on the chair when you sing "he climbed up in a sycamore tree." Be sure to stand by the chair to guard child's safety.

Work through the craft, step by step, with the children. Show them how to turn the father's face and how to flip the son over to show the son returning home.

Have the children build a house with the blocks. Sit with them as they build and talk about today's Bible story. Emphasize that God has given them a good home. *Optional:* Place a cardboard piece over the blocks to make a roof for each house.

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Teaching Tips

As children arrive, greet them with a warm smile. As they color their Take-Home paper, talk with them about their home (what color their house is, whether or not they have a pet, etc.).
