Scope & Sequence

Year 1		
Quarter	Title	Description
Quarter 1: Fall	Moses I Egypt to Sinai	Introduces the fascinating account of the life of Moses, from his providential birth to leading the Israelites out of Egypt. Practical applications and stimulating questions encourage biblical thinking.
Quarter 2: Winter	Moses II Sinai to Jordan River	Continues the captivating study of the life of Moses, including the Ten Commandments, the Tabernacle, and the Jordan River. Learn valuable lessons about God's character that are important today.
Quarter 3: Spring	Jesus' Beginning Ministry	Presents Jesus' early life, including prophecy of His coming, early life in Nazareth, ministry preparation, and early miracles. Jesus' life models perfectly how to live in service and submission to the Father.
Quarter 4: Summer	Beginnings in Genesis	Genesis records God's miraculous creation, the beginning of the human race, and such topics as the origin of sin and the sanctity of life. Christians grounded in the biblical creation account will be thoroughly prepared to share their faith with others.

Year 2		
Quarter	Title	Description
Quarter 1: Fall	Acts I	Sheds light on Christianity's early growth as Peter, Phillip, and others preach the Gospel, heal the sick, and cast out devils in His name. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, Jesus' followers exalt the Savior despite persecution.

Quarter 2: Winter	Acts II	Early church history unfolds as Paul takes the Gospel to the Gentiles. Despite persecution, shipwreck, and religious opposition, Paul remained firm in his devotion to Jesus.
Quarter 3: Spring	Joshua	Presents the exciting events of the Israelites as they cross the Jordan River, conquer Jericho, and fight internal and external battles to conquer Canaan. These events demonstrate living the Christian life victoriously in today's world.
Quarter 4: Summer	Learning from Jesus in Galilee	During Jesus' ministry in Galilee, multitudes witnessed His miracles and heard His teaching. Jesus' Sermon on the Mount teaches wonderful truths about the Christian's relationship to God and others.

Year 3		
Quarter	Title	Description
Quarter 1: Fall	Judges & Ruth	Learn how to live victoriously in this Satan-infested world by studying real people who find solutions to real problems. Lessons on Ruth reveal God's sovereignty in bringing redemption to mankind.
Quarter 2: Winter	Studies in 1st Samuel	First Samuel gives events in the lives of 3 important Bible characters. Samuel, the ideal servant of God from his youth to his death, receives miraculous answers to prayer. Saul, Israel's first king, is the opposite of Samuel. He was filled with pride, jealousy, and rebellion. God chastened him. Young David, a favorite Bible character, has a heart for God and a strong faith. His victories and difficulties prepare him to be Israel's next king.
Quarter 3: Spring	Jesus' Later Ministry	Follow Jesus' steps to Calvary as He performs miracles, preaches and teaches, and ministers to followers. The events of Jesus' final week—triumphal entry, last supper, crucifixion, resurrection—are covered in detail.

Quarter 4: Summer	King David/Solomon	David's life of triumph and tragedy presents valuable lessons about righteousness, marriage, family, faith and service. Solomon, who flourished in power, wealth, and wisdom, allowed personal weakness to corrode his throne and bring God's chastening.
